While the process is in action, students will be able to see how writing progresses. Together, the teacher and student can work on writing, revision, and viewing a final product. All Middle Schools	<u>4 ipads - MS Music</u>	With just one ipad I can help students practice note names, practice sight reading notes and rhythms, use as a metronome, a drum kit, on screen keyboard, build ostinatos, do improvisation, match pitches, teach form, demonstrate tone colour and timbre, use as a score reader, interactive listening, as a listening post, create a backing track to sing along with, capture student rehearsals and performances, and use as a TV camera. All Middle Schools	<u>Writing Workshop for Middle School students</u>	The 6th, 7th and 8th grade teachers would like to put on a writers workshop for students who struggle with writing. Last year the group of teachers had put in a request for only 8th grade students who struggled with writing and wanted to offer a session to help these students perform better on NeSA Writing. NeSA Writing is no longer a standalone test. The writing component is now incorporated into the NeSA Reading assessment in the form of Text Dependent Analysis. What the teachers, at all grade levels, would like to do is to offer a writing workshop to the students who struggle on the Fall Writing Assessment. The workshop would take place at EVVMS Middle School. All four middle schools would send kids and we would create a workshop model for these students to engage and improve in writing.
