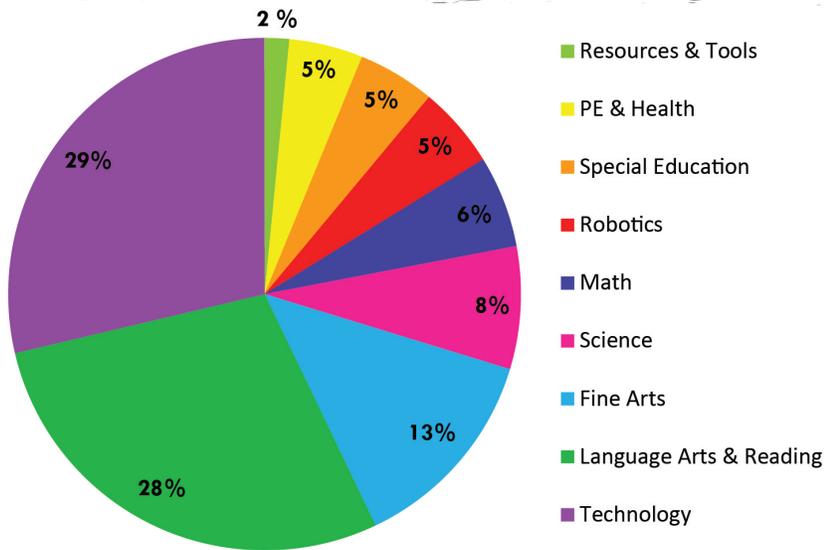

Along with our school wide pledge, we have the group Respect2All put on a play geared to bullying prevention and awareness. We do our rally in October to tie in with the nation-wide effort to stop bullying and encourage everyone to be tolerant of others. Elkhorn Middle School	<u>Teaching through the Arts: Elkhorn Middle School</u>	Teaching through the Arts: A Middle School Play provides an extracurricular activity that appeals to students who are interested in the performing arts. Benefit to Student Learning: Approval of this grant would keep the tradition of the fine arts activity that was established over eight years ago. This activity gives students experience in the performing arts before they are given more choices in which to participate at the high school level. It also gives them confidence in the arts before they are asked to participate at a more competitive level. In addition to helping students' future, this activity will also benefit students now. Socially, this activity will allow students to make new friends and commit to a group. This will teach students teamwork and working together for a common goal. Academically, this will improve student confidence in classroom participation and public speaking in class. Because students will need to remain in good academic standing to participate in the play, students will have a continual commitment to school work and academic excellence. As many students as possible will be included in this activity. A cast of 20 to 30 characters would be selected from an organized tryout of 7th and 8th grade students. Crews would also be formed to handle the set, costumes and scenery. Crew members would include students from 6th, 7th and 8th grade. This would incorporate at least 40+ more students. Additionally, student leaders would be selected to assist the director and lead the crews. This would include 10 more students. This would total about 80 or more students each school year.
