

Manchester Elementary	<u>ALEKS for Success</u>	ALEKS is an adaptive, online Math program that identifies precisely what each student knows and doesn't know. Through truly individualized learning and assessment, ALEKS delivers a personalized learning path on the exact topics each student is most ready to learn. Manchester will utilize ALEKS as a Tier 2 intervention within our intervention time/program. Students who meet specific criteria for Tier 2 Math Intervention will maximize their learning with ALEKS. It will supplement our Pearson Realize Math program and Tier 1 instruction. This grant will enable us to target individual student needs giving us a layered intervention approach. Manchester Elementary	<u>Using Playaways to Inspire Reading</u>	Playaways are self-contained audiobooks. Audiobooks not only appeal to strong readers, but they help target students who are low interest, nonreaders, or struggling readers. Students can read books that may be out of their reading level independently using Playaways. The devices help to increase comprehension, vocabulary, and fluency skills. Playaways can also be used to accommodate students who need text read aloud. Playaways appeal to all readers. Struggling readers will feel a sense of pride when they are able to independently read books and receive the same reading experiences as their peers. Playaways can also help challenge and motivate higher-level readers with more advanced texts. One AAA battery is required for each playaway and as multiple students check them out and use them, batteries will need to be replaced.	Robyn Dallegge	4th & 5th	\$1,456.00
Manchester Elementary	<u>Flocabulary For All</u>	Flocabulary is a highly engaging learning program for all grade levels. Teachers have access to hundreds of standards-based videos that use educational hip-hop music to keep students' attention and increase achievement. Students can also interact with the site to supplement instruction. Teachers can assign reading passages, activities and assessments for every student. Flocabulary allows teachers to assess student learning to guide instruction. Teachers are able to log in and collect data and reports on student assignments. There is even a teacher dashboard with individual student tracking. The resources available through the Flocabulary digital subscription will increase engagement and student achievement across the curriculum.	Jessica Becker	K-5th	\$2,000.00
Manchester Elementary	<u>Crash Can Percussion Stations</u>	The items in the crash can percussion set will allow each student to have a percussion station with different timbres. One percussion set includes: crash can, drum sticks, tambourine, pop toob, cutting board and felt pads. Manchester Elementary	<u>IXL Language Arts K-5</u>	IXL Language Arts will benefit students kindergarten through fifth grades both for intervention and enrichment and both during school hours and at home to reinforce and extend skills. We would like to continue to offer this program to our students as they continue at Manchester Elementary. The IXL Language Arts program focuses on a variety of skills for students to help us reach our building wide smart goal in the area of writing. Teachers also love IXL because they can see their students' progress immediately. They are able to see exactly which problems students miss, where trouble spots may be, how they have progressed over time, and how much knowledge they have truly understood and retained.
