

TOPSoccer is a US Youth Soccer program that stands for The Outreach Program for Soccer. It's a program designed to provide opportunities for players who, for physical, mental or emotional reasons, cannot commit to a conventionally structured soccer competition. **TOPSoccer** participants include players with Autism, Down's Syndrome, and physical disabilities. The Elkhorn Public Schools Foundation funds grant requests from Elkhorn Public Schools' Special Education teachers which have included thematic language and crosscurricular activities, equipment for sensory processing needs, toys for play skills therapy and much more!


