






5TH ANNUAL

The Elkhorn Public Schools Foundation hosted its 5th Annual Bids 4 Kids Ladies Night Out on April 6th at Noah's Event Venue. 



MAKING A DIFFERENCE: COMMUNITY OUTREACH

The Elkhorn Public Schools Foundation is dedicated to increasing quality education through partnerships with local community foundations. Thank you to the Richard Brooke Foundation and the Criss Memorial Foundation for stepping up and providing funding for classrooms and students in Elkhorn Public Schools!

Richard Brooke Foundation



The Richard Brooke Foundation has funded 31 classroom grants since 2015! This summer the Richard Brooke Foundation donated \$31,500 to the Elkhorn Public Schools Foundation to purchase 11 SMART Projectors for Elkhorn Public Schools' classrooms. Teachers and students at Hillrise Elementary, Spring Ridge Elementary, Westridge Elementary, Elkhorn High School and Elkhorn South High School will return to school with new technology in their classrooms which will facilitate hands-on interactive learning.

Criss Memorial Foundation

The Criss Memorial Foundation helped the Elkhorn Young Adult Transition Program with a generous grant that funded raised garden beds and a covered patio swing. Both of these items will bring inclusivity to those in walkers and wheelchairs, allowing them to fully participate in the Young Adult Program activities.



Summer School Achievements

This summer, the Foundation had the privilege of providing a bounce house rental and Kona Ice for all 274 students that attended summer school.
