Spring Ridge Elementary	<u>Television</u>	This classroom grant project would provide a ClearTouch Interactive Panel – 6000A+ for use in my school counseling office to support small-group and social-emotional learning instruction. The ClearTouch panel offers a large, bright, interactive display that allows for direct touch interaction, annotation, and real-time modeling during lessons. As a school counselor, I deliver Tier 2 small-group instruction using district-approved, computer-based SEL curriculum, and this technology would allow those lessons to be implemented as designed. Currently, instruction is limited to my computer screen, which restricts visibility and hands-on engagement for students. The ClearTouch panel would allow students to actively participate by interacting with content, visuals, and activities while I model skills such as emotion regulation, problem-solving, and peer interaction. Chorus (formerly Canvas) and Command are included with the purchase, ensuring seamless integration with district systems.
